

# SHENTON CONSERVATION AREA MANAGEMENT PLAN

15 & 16 Silson Road, pair of typical 'Shenton' Estate semi-detached dwellings scattered throughout the settlement. Several of these dwellings have had their windows replaced with UPVC windows that detract from their traditional character. Timber windows should be utilized if replacement windows are needed.

Stud farm comprises an excellent group of buildings situated at the bend on Silson Lane. However, several buildings are in need of maintenance.

Many of the estate dwellings have retained their original outhouses in their rear gardens that once consisted of toilet, coal store and communal washroom. The outhouses are important elements in the conservation area which should be retained. Several are in need of urgent maintenance work.

The small fenced area together with the latter bin, timber seat post box and directional signs are an important group of features at this key intersection. The area needs to be tidied up and the concrete street light replaced with an heritage light.

This small building that was once used as a joiner's shop is now derelict. It is in need of maintenance or will be lost.
