Royal Arms Pub situated at the north eastern entrance into the conservation Area on Main Street. The original property has been extended to the side and rear.



The fixed blue canopies, bow windows, signs and planting tubs fronting the pub tend to detract from the character of the conservation area.

Laurel Cottage a fine Georgian dwelling fronting Main Street that retains its traditional integrity. The property has a slate roof and low boundary wall with steps up to the front door.



Ordchard Cottage is a modern dwelling that does not reflect the traditional character of the settlement due to its modern brickwork and design.



Tempsford, a rendered property on Main Street flanked either side by traditional brick walls with saddleback copings.



Forge Cottage, a part brick /rendered dwelling set back from the highway. The use of concrete roof tiles tend to detract from its traditional character.



The former farm building on Main Street has been retained by successfully converting it into garages and storage accommodation. The building is one of numerous red brick buildings dispersed within the settlement.
