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1. Main Modifications Summary

Throughout the hearing sessions on the Site Allocations and Development Management Policies DPD, a number of Main Modifications were identified as being required in order to address potential issues relating to soundness. The majority of these modifications focussed around policy wording and the inclusion of additional text in the plan to improve clarity, however a number would directly affect potential allocations in the Plan. These Main Modifications should be subject to Sustainability Appraisal where necessary.

Details of these modifications can be found in the 'Schedule of Main Modifications' document, however, a summary of these is contained within the Table 1 below. Due to the nature of a number of the Modifications, it is not considered necessary to produce a Sustainability Appraisal for all of these modifications, therefore Table 1 also outlines which Modification will be subject to appraisal and which will not.

In addition to these Main Modifications, a number of additional modifications (Minor Amendments) are also proposed to the document. Due to the very minor nature of these amendments, they would not be subject to Sustainability Appraisal and are therefore not referenced within this document.

2. Methodology

To remain consistent with other supporting Sustainability Appraisal documents, each modification has been assessed against each of the 24 Sustainability Criteria identified within the Hinckley and Bosworth Sustainability Appraisal Scoping Report (2012). Where a modification is proposed to an allocation or a policy, they have been assessed as a whole using past Sustainability Appraisals as a baseline. Where the modification has amended the scoring against one of the criteria, this is specific referenced and commentary made as to how the Main Modification has had a positive or negative impact on the sustainability of the plan.

The Sustainability Criteria are as follows:

- 1. To ensure the provision of decent and affordable housing that meets local needs, links into the provision of services and an accessible local environment.
- **2.** To improve health and reduce health inequalities by promoting healthy lifestyles, protecting health and providing access to health services.
- **3.** To provide better opportunities for local people and tourists to access and understand local heritage, including our natural history.
- **4.** To improve access to and participation in cultural and leisure activities.
- **5.** To improve community safety, reduce the fear of crime and reduce anti-social behaviour.
- **6.** To promote and support the empowerment of local communities in creating and implementing solutions that meet their needs focusing particularly on young, elderly and deprived people.
- 7. To preserve and enhance the natural environment (species and habitats) and green infrastructure whilst contributing to the achievement of Biodiversity Action Plan targets.
- **8.** To conserve and enhance the built and natural character, diversity and local distinctiveness of towns and villages in Hinckley and Bosworth district.
- **9.** To preserve and enhance the character and appearance and setting of archaeological sites, historic buildings, conservation sites, historic parks and other cultural assets including heritage assets on the 'Heritage at Risk' Register.
- **10.** To conserve and enhance the character, diversity and local distinctiveness of the rural landscape in the borough area.
- **11.** To conserve and enhance woodland cover in the borough area, particularly where it supports the National Forest area.
- **12.** To maintain and improve the quality of water resources and protect the flood plain.
- **13.** To improve air quality particularly through reducing transport related pollutants.
- **14.** To proactively manage mineral resources and avoid/reduce pollution of land.
- **15.** To minimise energy use and develop renewable energy resources.
- **16.** To reduce greenhouse gas emissions to mitigate the rate of climate change.
- **17.** To improve access to education and training for children, young people and adult learners.

- **18.** To develop a strong culture of enterprise and innovation whilst providing access to appropriate employment opportunities for the local population, particularly in rural areas.
- **19.** To help farmers diversify their agricultural activities or venture into new rural businesses. To help other rural businesses diversify their activities.
- **20.** To optimise the use of previously developed land, buildings and existing infrastructure.
- **21.** To promote and ensure high standards of sustainable design and construction.
- **22.** To minimise waste and to increase the re-use and recycling of waste materials.
- **23.** To improve access to services, particularly for the rural population, those without a car and for disabled, elderly and deprived people.
- **24.** To encourage and develop the use of public transport, cycling and walking as alternatives to the private car.

An appraisal was made which provides a judgement on the likely effect that the Main Modification would have on the Sustainability Objectives. The likely impact of each of the sites on a specific objective was assigned using the following scoring mechanism:

Each score for a likely effect on an Objective is accompanied by relevant justification alongside to fully explain its award.

3. Conclusions

Following the additional Sustainability Appraisal of each of the Main Modification, it is considered that most improve the sustainability of the allocations or policies which they will be amending. This is a positive development in the plan and should therefore be supported as no further significant adverse impacts are anticipated as a result of the Main Modifications. Any adverse which had previously been identified in earlier iterations of the Sustainability Appraisal work will be monitored in line with the potential mitigation measures detailed in the Monitoring and Infrastructure Framework.

Where a modification related to the removal of a proposed allocation, it is considered that all impacts would be neutral due to the Main Modification maintaining the status quo. Due to this, these assessments did not find any impacts arising from the Main Modification however it was considered important to assess these to ensure that there would be no adverse impact on the plan as a whole.

A summary of the Appraisals for each of the Main Modifications is below:

MM5	As they are inextricably linked, these modifications have been assessed together. Although the Modification of including additional land to the south of

MM15	Although this policy has undergone major changes due to the recent Government changes, it is not considered that this would result in a significant change to the sustainability of the policy. As the changes relate solely to the development of wind energy, other forms of renewable energy development would still be supported through the implementation of this policy and therefore its positive environmental impact would remain.	
MM16	It is not considered that the modifications proposed to this policy would have a significant effect on its sustainability. The inclusion of references to Green Wedges in policy DM4 would however increase the prominence of these important aspects of Green Infrastructure and would therefore have a positive impact on this element of the Local Plan as a whole by cross referencing to the Core Strategy.	
MM17	It is not considered that the modifications proposed to this policy would have a significant effect on its sustainability. The inclusion of references to Green Wedges in policy DM9 would however increase the prominence of these important aspects of Green Infrastructure and would therefore have a positive impact on this element of the Local Plan as a whole by cross referencing to the Core Strategy.	
MM18	The modifications to this policy predominantly relate to the rationalisation of a number of criteria into one more coherent criterion. This is not considered to effect the sustainability appraisal results of this policy.	
	The modification to the criterion in relation to the establishment of charging points for electric vehicles is still a policy objective although it is no longer a firm requirement for development. This could potentially reduce the delivery of these points although not to a degree that would affect the sustainability of the	

	policy.
MM20	Although it is considered that the modifications would improve its effectiveness, as the modifications to this policy relate to the protection of specific elements of conservation areas it is considered that the changes are too specific to have a significant impact on the sustainability objectives.
MM21	It is not considered that the proposed modification to this policy would effect its sustainability as it has introduced a more positive form of wording.
MM22	Due to the minor wording change in the policy relating to alteration of existing buildings, it is not considered that the proposed modification to this policy would effect its sustainability.
MM23	The amendments to this policy have significantly increased the focus of the policy on sustainable transport modes and the promotion of walking and cycling. It is considered that the amendments would significantly improve the sustainability of the policy and potential impact that on new development in the borough.
MM24	It is not considered that the proposed modification to this policy would have a significant impact on its sustainability in relation to the sustainability objectives. The modification is however considered to provide some additional local context.
MM25	Due to its minor nature, it is not considered that the proposed modification to this policy would have a significant impact on its sustainability in relation to the sustainability objectives.
ММ26	The modification to this policy provides a more positive approach to the establishment and development of new cultural and tourism facilities providing they are accessible by a range of transport modes. It is therefore considered that this would improve the sustainability of this policy in relation to a number of sustainability objectives, particularly those relating access to facilities and the promotion of sustainable transport.
